Dear Parents and Guardians,

Please note that on February 25, all 9th and 10th-grade students will take the Pre-ACT. Students need to report to school at 7:45 am. During the first week of February, room assignments will be posted throughout the campus and on Canvas (All-School). Testing will begin at 7:55. a.m. Standard time students should finish testing between 11:30 am and noon. Extended time students should complete testing between 1:30 pm - 2:00 pm. Seniors will be having their on-campus retreat, and Juniors will have the Junior Recognition Ceremony; more details will follow. Please be sure to mark your calendar!

The Bloodmobile will be here Tuesday, February 1st from 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Those who are at least 16 and in good health are eligible to donate the "gift of life." Three hours of community service is available for one pint of blood donated plus a free T-shirt and Chick-Fil-A sandwiches.







<u>Please ONLY use Attendance@cmhs-sarasota.org</u> to submit notes digitally. ALL absences still need to be called into the Attendance Hotline 941-487-2500.

Anytime your student is out of school, needs to be dismissed early, or comes to school late, a note is required. We ask that all notes for early dismissal be sent first thing in the morning or dropped off at the Front Office. This will help avoid a delay in dismissal and/or an interruption to your student's class.
